

America's policy on refugees

Regarding the influx of refugees to the United States, we need only look to Europe and Turkey to see the disastrous consequences of those misbegotten policies. The United States government has admitted that it is and has been unable to completely vet these refugees, thus leaving the door wide open for ISIS fighters and other terrorists to immigrate legally. This, of course, is in addition to the regular trafficking taking place on the US-Mexico border, where potential terrorists move freely back and forth - according to other statements from our government.

There is a simple solution to the problem of unvetted refugees.

1. The first part is to **enforce current law**, protecting our borders and thoroughly vetting potential immigrants. Where vetting is incomplete or not possible, those persons will not be admitted to the United States. This includes enforcing all provisions of the Voting Rights Act.
2. The second part involves **diplomatic arrangements** between the United States and the countries from which the refugees come. The DOJ and the INS struggle, or so they claim, with deportation because in many cases the person's country of origin refuses to accept them back. These diplomatic arrangements would enable us to expel any immigrant or refugee convicted of a crime in the U.S. and to deny entry to anyone convicted of a crime outside the U.S. prior to their entry into the U.S. The process of deportation should be streamlined and greatly accelerated.
3. Finally, those who invite and welcome refugees into the U.S. must **bear responsibility** for them. Each individual refugee must be **sponsored** by a particular responsible party or group, such as a church or charitable organization. Our government bears no responsibility for immigrants except to shower them with our tax dollars and provide seemingly limitless benefits. This party will ensure a) that the immigrant receives no Social Security or other benefits except those provided by their own sponsoring organization, b) that they obtain employment as quickly as possible, and c) that they ensure that the immigrants quickly learn to speak English and integrate into American society.

Most important, these responsible parties must **indemnify the American people** against harm done by the immigrants. If an immigrant or refugee commits a crime while in the U.S. the responsible party must perform **full restitution** to the victim(s) of the crime(s). In the event of murder or physical harm, the responsible party should be required to pay a pre-agreed sum at a minimum and be liable for lawsuits from the injured party. For example, a payment of \$5 million should be required for each American murdered and \$1 million for each American physically attacked and injured or raped. These payments must not come from tax dollars, because then the American people are paying themselves for harm caused by non-Americans.

Obviously there are few groups, individuals, or charities who could bear the cost of such crimes. Their outcry would be that these regulations prevent us from being charitable, but that is not the case. America must secure its borders if its citizens are to enjoy the blessings of freedom. We must understand and consent to the obligations placed upon us as we are taxed to death to benefit others who will not assimilate and who create division (groups like La Raza) or who commit horrific crimes against innocent Americans.

Government is **not** the solution. Government is incapable of fulfilling its primary responsibility of protecting American citizens, and will continue so until such time as the conflicted missions

government creates are delineated before the American people and the people given the opportunity to see for themselves the terrible mistakes wrought by our leaders.
